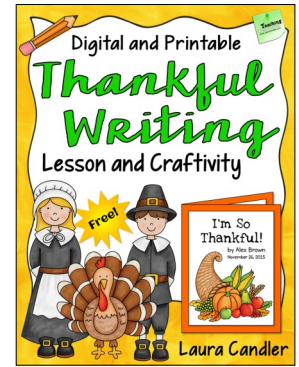


Thankful Writing Activity

Google Slides Resources

The links provided below are for teacher use only and are not intended to be given directly to students. Because many schools have firewalls that block student access to outside resources, you must first add these documents to your school Google Drive account and then assign them to your students in Google Classroom.

Before you click on the blue document links below, create a folder in your school Google Drive called Thankful Writing Activity. Then click each link and add the document to your Google Drive. Remove the words “Copy of” from the title and move each document into your Thankful Writing Activity folder.

Next, open each document, review it, and make changes if needed. You can modify most of these documents by clicking on **View → Master** and making changes to the Master Slide.

Most of these resources require students to move objects or edit the text on the slide. If you assign these Google Slides to your students via Google Classroom, be sure to assign **editable copies** rather than giving them view-only links.
