I think I'm pretty intentional about how I praise my students, but was convicted that I need to watch my words I really worked last year to praise effort, and not ability. I was amazed at the difference it made in my 5th grade class. 1 student who the previous teacher stated was completely unmotivated, worked extremely hard and Praising for effort gives the students the confidence to try harder. Praising for intelligence makes the students hesitant to try something because they are afraid they will fail and viewed as not "smart".

We have to be intentional with our praise and feedback to students

what a powerful impact just a slight difference in praise has on a student's ability to work hard and take on challenges. This would be useful to know when taking on STEM challenges in the classroom.
